Lunchtime clubs for KS2 have been organised and parents will be notified if their child has a space. These are only running for 3 weeks and will be reviewed in September.

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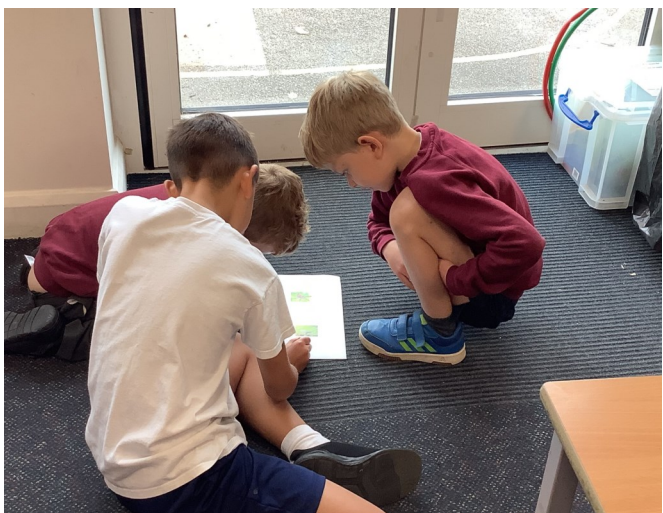
House Nature Quiz
